

All who seek God have a perennial tendency to idolize the means through which he is made known to us. Perhaps it was by means of an altar call that God wonderfully broke into our lives. 




DISCERNMENT MEANS STRUGGLING TO CONSTANTLY CHOOSE BETWEEN OUR WILL & GOD'S WILL

- * Every moment of discernment is a moment of uncertainty because it is a process of learning, experiencing, trial and error, and commitment...
- * It is determining whether we want God's will, or are we just hoping God will ratify our will?
 - * Is the answer we are seeking really what God wants, or a guess or a hope?
 - * Are we really available to hear God's will, or our emotions around our desire so strong that we are unavailable?
 - * Strong emotions cloud our ability to discern, even if discernment includes emotions.

HOW DO WE PRACTICE DISCERNMENT?

- A. **Center** and calm your mind, let go of emotions, and become open to whatever God might say—this means being willing to seek and accept an answer we don't want.
- B. Ask God for guidance
 - * Be specific.
 - * Be persistent.
 - * Be patient.
 - * Be receptive

HOW DO WE PRACTICE DISCERNMENT?

- C. **Listen Prayerfully** for how God may speak to you directly, through conversations, music, art, poetry, nature, the Bible, the church, and life.
- D. **Sift** through possibilities:
 - * Consider all possibilities, and try to get a sense of what "seems" right (not just what makes rational sense).
 - * Reject those that don't "seem" right, especially if you really know they are wrong.
 - * Give it the test of time, so that even if you think something is right, keep asking prayerfully if this is what God wants.
 - * Talk with others about what you sense God is saying, and get confirmation.
 - * Always be ready to re-discern.

HOW DOES GOD USUALLY SPEAK TO US?

- Others, scripture, television, film, literature, art, etc...
- Inspirations
- Circumstances and experiences
- Symbols and metaphors.
- Signs
- A quiet voice within...

HOW DO WE KNOW IF AN ANSWER IS FROM GOD

- Generally we get a sense of peace and calm, along with a conviction that it is "right."
- Coincidences and Providences will occur, suggesting that the present course is right.
- Things will seem to work out.
- These confirmations are mostly subtle, and rarely dramatic, which is why discernment gets harder in groups and boards.

WHY DON'T I SEEM TO HEAR GOD?

- *Our pride and ego may be interfering ~ "what I want," and not what God wants, may be getting in the way.
- •We may be doing may already be what God wants, and you just have to be patient and wait to see what God is going to do.
- •We may be in a time of testing and transformation, where God's focus isn't on answering us, but on deepening our faith.

Jesus' good news about the kingdom can be an effective guide for our lives only if we share his view of the world in which we live. To his eyes this is a God- bathed and God-permeated world. It is a world filled with a glorious reality, where every component is within the range of God's direct knowledge and control – though he obviously permits some of it, for good reasons, to be for a while otherwise than as he wishes. It is a world that is inconceivably beautiful and good because of God and because God is always in it. It is a world in which God is continually at play and over which he constantly rejoices. Until our thoughts of God have found every visible thing and event glorious with his presence, the word of Jesus has not yet fully seized us.
