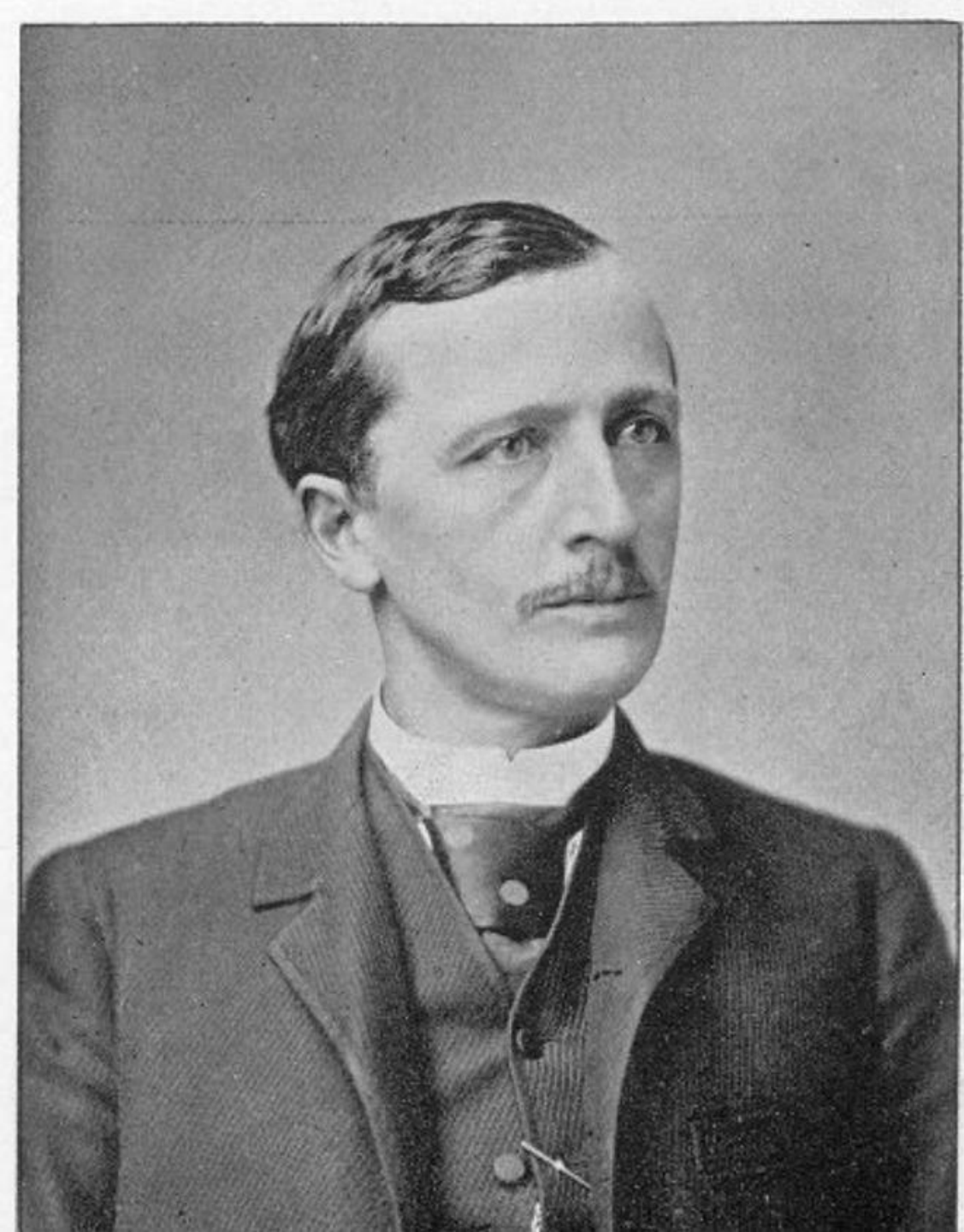


Coxey's Army

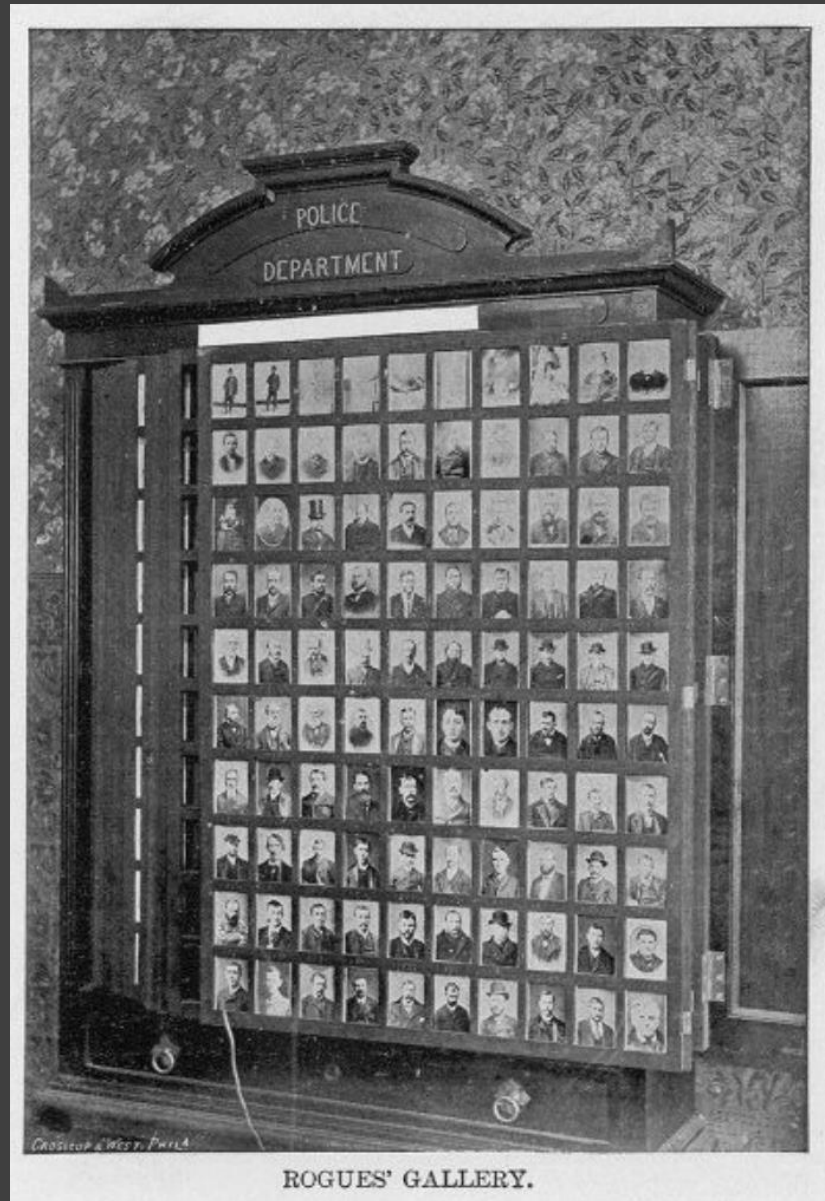

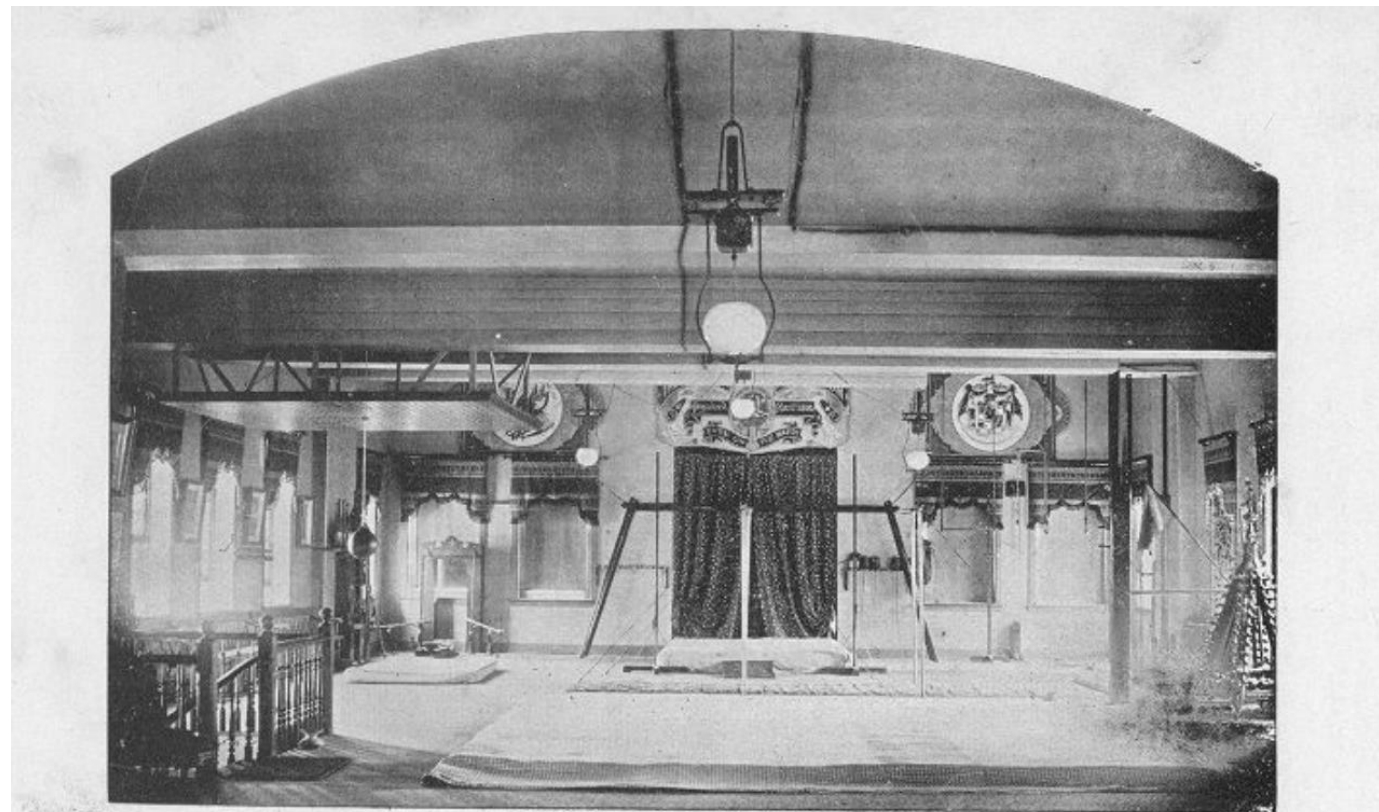
